The purpose of this Toolbox is to provide essential information, documentation and support to you in the delivery of the Local Skills Improvement (LSIF) contract.

This Toolbox has been produced to be used in conjunction with the Funding Agreement Project Revenue, Capital and output requirements and in line with DfE LSIF Guidance doc.

LSIF Overview

Allocation to West Yorkshire Colleges from the Department for Education. £1.7 m Revenue and £5.3 capital over 18 months.

The project will support colleges and partners to build capacity to meet local skills priorities that were identified in the <u>Local Skills Improvement Plan (LSIP)</u>, launched by the West and North Yorkshire Chamber of Commerce in August 2023.

The Consortium colleges and partners will collaborate to develop current and new digitised training provision and curriculum for key industries.

The colleges will open specialist hubs and academies offering high level curriculum using immersive and digital technology and Artificial Intelligence.

The capital investment will include equipment and resources needed to use virtual reality, augmented reality, Artificial Intelligence and robotics to equip colleges with the means to develop relevant and in-demand skills.

The funding has been split into six key areas with investment for digital innovation in:

- 1. Construction,
- 2. Creative industries,
- 3. Health and Care,
- 4. Advanced manufacturing,
- 5. Financial technology (Fintech),
- 6. Wider digital development of teaching and learning.

A continuation of the collaboration model developed under the Strategic Development Fund leading to improved co-ordination and efficiency.

- · Developing co-ordinated specialist partnership hubs,
- · Knowledge transfer,
- · Provide industry CPD collectively,
- Enhance the effectiveness of teaching & learning across all curriculum areas.

Each area will be led by a West Yorkshire college that will lead the innovation, host the digital hub and share experience and knowledge and develop teaching and learning across all colleges.

Funding cannot be moved between LSIF categories or between Revenue and Capital allocations or be carried over into the next financial year. Funding can be varied **within** category without DFE approval.

Partners can revise the annual profile forecast at each funding claim. Please note that there is no formal change request, and no considerations will generally be made in terms of moving funds between categories. If there is an "exceptional circumstance" this would need to be requested in writing to the DFE.

Claims and Evidence

- Evidence to be received 7 days prior to claim date (See Timetable below) via Google Drive
- Evidence to be sent monthly
- Funding can only be claimed when activity has taken place invoiced and paid (defrayed) with the exception of end of year (Mar 24 and Mar 25) when funds may be accrued based on purchase orders and invoices. Please note that Goods/Services claimed for must be paid by the end of May 24/May 25 respectively.
- All purchases should be made in line with the organisation procurement policy and procedures – Please ensure that a copy of your procurement policy is made available to WYCC ahead of submitting any claims.
